Turban of Prophet Joseph (Yusuf a.s)



Al-Badiya Mosque in Fujairah, United Arab Emirates. It was built in the 1400s and is the oldest mosque in the UAE



Turban, Shawl and Sandal attributed to the Prophet Muhammad (s.a.w)



Egypt's oldest mosque the Mosque of Amr ibn al As in Cairo. Built in 641



The Dzhumaya Mosque in Plovdiv, Bulgaria. Built in 1363, it is the oldest mosque in Bulgaria.



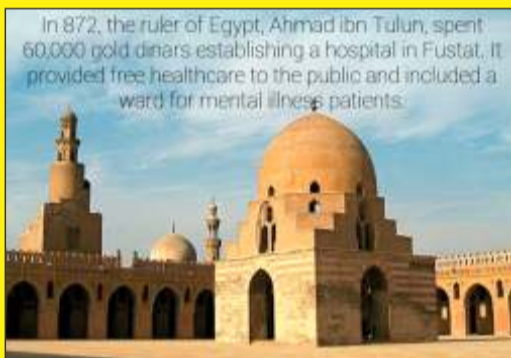
The Great Mosque of Xi'an, China. The oldest mosque in China. Built in 742.



Agadez Mosque in Agadez, Niger. Niger's oldest mosque. Built in 1515.



Kobe Mosque in Kobe, Japan. Japan's oldest mosque. Built in 1935.



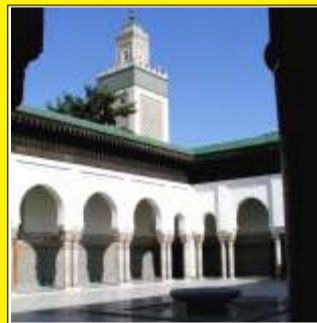
In 872, the ruler of Egypt, Ahmad ibn Tulun, spent 60,000 gold dinars establishing a hospital in Fustat. It provided free healthcare to the public and included a ward for mental illness patients.



The Emperor's Mosque in Sarajevo, Bosnia. Built in 1457, it is Bosnia's oldest mosque.



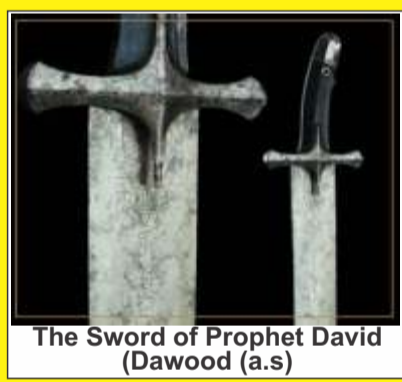
The Mosque of Uqba in Kairouan, Tunisia. Tunisia's oldest mosque. Built in 670.



The Grand Mosque of Paris, France. Built in 1926



The Taipei Grand Mosque is the oldest mosque in Taiwan. It was built in 1947 by Chinese Muslim immigrants from mainland China



The Sword of Prophet David (Dawood a.s)



The Umayyad Mosque of Damascus, Syria. The oldest mosque in Syria. Originally built in 634, the current structure dates to 715.



The minaret of the Koutoubia Mosque in Marrakesh, Morocco. Built in the late 1100s by the al-Muwahhidunn (Almohad) Dynasty.



Mother Mosque of America in Cedar Rapids, Iowa. The United States' oldest mosque. Built in 1934.



The Larabanga Mosque in Larabanga, Ghana.



The Al-Rashid Mosque in Edmonton, Canada. It was built in 1938 and is Canada's oldest mosque. It resembles a Ukrainian Orthodox church because the contractor who built it was Ukrainian who was unfamiliar with mosque architecture.



The Niujie Mosque was first built in 996 during the Liao Dynasty (916-1125). The Mongols razed the mosque to the ground when they conquered Beijing. A replacement was built in 1442 in the Ming Dynasty and expanded in 1696 under the Qing Dynasty. The mosque underwent three renovations in 1955, 1979 and 1996. The building recently had a US 2.5 million renovation and facelift.



Kampung Laut Mosque in Kelantan, Malaysia. It was built in the 1700s and is the oldest mosque in Malaysia.



The Malé Friday Mosque, built in 1658, is oldest mosque in the Maldives, and is mostly constructed out of coral.



The interior of Masjid Omar Kampong Melaka, Singapore's oldest mosque. Originally built in 1820, and rebuilt most recently in the 1980s.
